## **Grit Bins**

With winter officially here all grit bins are being topped up and the area surrounding the bin is being trimmed for ease of access. If you are aware of a bin being missed, could you please let the Parish Clerk know.

In January 2013, the Parish Council having been told that Amey would not provide a grit bin at the bottom of Bobblestock Hill, agreed to fund a bin and subsequently placed an order with Amev. With the change of contractor to Balfour Beatty in September 2013, the Parish Council was informed that they would have to go through the process again. Frustrated by the lack of action, the Parish Council at their meeting in November decided to purchase the bin and arrange for this to be sited by the lengthsman as soon as possible.

We are delighted to note that with the help of our ward councilor, the public right of way from The Furlongs onto Attwood lane is now open and being used by residents.

Community Speedwatch – Excessive or inappropriate speeding is dangerous and is responsible for many unnecessary injuries and collisions. It is a serious traffic offence which affects the quality of life of many communities and certainly by the number of people who have contacted me recently it is affecting OUR community.

In response to residents' concerns, I have provisionally signed up to the new initiative, Community Speedwatch. A minimum of 6 volunteers is required and in the initial stages, the Safer Roads Team would like to concentrate on one road but there will always be an option to expand into other roads as time progresses. As a volunteer you will receive training on health and safety, legislation, use of the speed detection equipment and be covered by the Force's public liability and personal accident insurance policies. Volunteers will only be accepted once appropriate checks have been carried out. Interested in helping, willing to give a regular commitment and adhere to the scheme's safety rules, then please let me know.

I am going to put forward Attwood Lane/Churchway and Roman Road for consideration so if you would like another area to be considered please contact me but bear in mind that the area must have a 30 mph or 40 mph speed restriction.

Core Strategy – The Parish Council and I submitted our representations to The Secretary of State raising concerns over the proposed Core Strategy and in particular the Holmer West site. These submissions will form part of the evidence for the Public Inquiry stage of the Core Strategy next year and you can view all the documents on Herefordshire Council's website.

Bin Collections - I hope you are getting used to the new bin system and it has not caused too many problems for you. If you forget your recycling collection day, you can take advantage of the council's free text messaging service. All you need to do is text "hcrecycle", your postcode and first line of your address to 80800 and you will receive a text the evening before your recycling is due to be collected.

# **EMERGENCY CONTACT DISC**

Warwickshire Police and West Mercia Police have launched a tax disc replacement called the Emergency Contact Disc.

The Emergency Contact Disc contains next of kin contact details and medical alert information for the driver. In the event of a medical emergency or road traffic collision that renders the occupants unable to communicate, a first responder will be able to obtain vital information that is not otherwise accessible at the scene.



The disc can be cut out and placed into the now otherwise redundant tax disc holder, the information sections fold inwards so it would not be viewed by passers by. 
#### **Newsletter**

#### LENGTHSMAN SCHEME

In May 2013, the Parish Council signed up to the Lengthsman Scheme. The purpose of this initiative is to devolve some minor highway works to the parish council. This has enabled us to identify minor defects and maintenance requirements and, in many instances, repair them with funds allocated by Herefordshire Council.

Examples of the type of work covered under the scheme are: clear debris and leaves away from drains and gullies; clear vegetation away from unlit signs, repaint finger and mile posts, verge cutting, cut back hedges encroaching on footways, paint and repair fences, minor storm debris onto the highway. The lengthsman unfortunately is not allowed to carry out work on 'A' Roads. If there is a problem in your area which fits into one of these categories, please contact the Parish Clerk.
